

Gospel Generosity

SERMON DATE: 04/12/2026 | Luke 12:24-33

WARM-UP QUESTION:

What are some of the most generous things you've ever heard of someone doing? Maybe it was something that was done for you?

PRAY TOGETHER

FOR GROUP DISCUSSION:

Ask someone to read Isaiah Luke 12:24-33 aloud.

Q1: *In this passage, Jesus repeatedly points to who God is before He talks about what we should do. What do we learn about God's character and care from these verses?*

Q2: *Jesus tells His disciples not to worry about basic needs like food and clothing. Why do you think believing God cares about our needs is just as important as believing He is able to meet them?*

Q3: *In verses 24 and 27, Jesus highlights God's ongoing provision for His creation (birds, lilies, etc.). How do these examples challenge the belief that provision depends mostly on our effort, planning, or resources?*

Q4: *Jesus says, "Do not be afraid, little flock, for your Father has been pleased to give you the kingdom" (v. 32). How does this statement reshape the way we view needs, fear, and generosity?*

Q5: *What is the relationship between faith and generosity in this passage? Compare how fear tends to close our hands, while trust opens them?*

Q6: *In verses 31–33, Jesus connects seeking God's Kingdom with generosity toward others. Why do you think generosity is such a natural overflow of trusting God's promises?*

Q8: *Verse 34 says, "Where your treasure is, there your heart will be also." Describe how your heart could really get "into" begin generous as you see God providing over and over as you give.*

Q9 *Are there any concrete steps of generosity God might be inviting you to take— in serving, giving, speaking, etc.?*

Close in prayer
